



Chief David Glass, Chief of Fire Prevention

Chief Glass has over 31 years of experience with the Shreveport Fire Department as a Firefighter, Fire/Arson Investigator, and Bomb Technician. He began his career on January 16th, 1978. Chief Glass was promoted to Fire Inspector on May 16th, 1983, Asst. Chief of Fire Prevention in January 1994. He currently serves as Chief of Fire Prevention since January 2002, and has been the department's Bomb Squad Commander since 1995. In December in 2007 he was appointed to Interim Fire Chief and served there until June of 2008 before returning as Chief of Fire Prevention.

Chief Glass is nationally certified as a Fire Investigator by the International Association of Arson Investigators and Fire Officer by the National Board on Fire Service Professional Qualifications. He is also a POST certified law enforcement officer, graduating from the SPD Basic Law Enforcement class in 1992. He serves as the 1st Asst. International Association of Bomb Technicians and Investigators which is a professional association of over 5000 members from 62 countries.

Mr. Glass has served and instructor for the Department of Homeland Security and as an adjunct instructor for LSU-Eunice's Fire Science Degree program in fire service management, fire codes and arson/explosives investigations. He is a frequent instructor/speaker at the Shreveport Fire/Police Regional Training Academy on bomb threat management, incidents involving explosives, weapons of mass destruction and emergency management.

Chief Glass delivers presentations to local and national fire/police audiences on fire and explosives related topics. Mr. Glass holds a bachelors degree in Business Administration and an Associate Degree in Fire Science.
