## **CHESAPEAKE'S CNG ROAD TRIP WITH MAYOR GLOVER**

SHREVEPORT, LOUISIANA, JUNE 10, 2010 – Chesapeake Energy Corporation (NYSE:CHK) representatives and City of Shreveport Mayor Cedric Glover departed this morning from Shreveport on a road trip to demonstrate the use of Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) as a transportation fuel.

Traveling in Chesapeake's bi-fuel Tahoe, the Mayor and representatives of Chesapeake made the 400-mile trip to Oklahoma City, Okla. on CNG, switching to gasoline when necessary, and refueling at a CNG station near Dallas.

"I am proud and eager to get started on our road trip to Oklahoma City today to show the utility of compressed natural gas as a viable alternative fuel for cars and trucks," said Mayor Glover. "I believe that natural gas vehicles represent a major part of our country's future when it comes to clean, affordable and accessible fuels for both fleet and personal travel. It is a pleasure to partner with Chesapeake to demonstrate this

abundant natural resource and the opportunities it could bring to Shreveport and Northwest Louisiana. I am also proud that several of our SporTran buses are powered by CNG and showcasing the efficiency and viability of CNG as a clean-burning fuel."

The Mayor was planning to visit Oklahoma City to attend the U.S. Conference of Mayors, and developed the idea of a trip on CNG to show his support of Haynesville Shale development and alternative transportation fuels. Chesapeake's bi-fuel vehicle was accommodating in that it is fueled by gasoline and CNG.

"The abundance of economically recoverable natural gas in the Haynesville Shale and other parts of the country provides an opportunity to successfully address our economic, environmental and energy issues with an American and much lower carbon fuel," said Kevin McCotter, Chesapeake's Senior Director of Corporate Development, Haynesville Shale. "Chesapeake embraces opportunities to educate the public on the natural gas industry. That fact coupled with the Mayor's enthusiastic support of CNG vehicles made a trip in our bi-fuel the perfect opportunity to showcase the power and opportunity available in this clean, abundant and American fuel."
