

May 23, 2012 - Home Damaged by Early Morning Fire in Stoner Hill Neighborhood

Three adult occupants living in the home escaped without injury

The Shreveport Fire Department responded to 1816 Acorn Street in the Stoner Hill Community this morning at 3:54 AM for a reported house fire. Fire crews arrived on scene from Station #5 within two minutes and found a one-story wood frame home with flames and heavy smoke coming from a bedroom on the front corner of the home. Fire crews entered the home conducting a quick search for any occupants and extinguishing the fire placing it under control at 4:07 AM.

There were three adult occupants living in the home. One had just left for work and the other two escaped without injury. One of the occupants stated he was on the computer in the back of the home and noticed a glow in that front room and began smelling smoke. That is when he and the other occupant exited the home and called 9-1-1.

The exact cause of the fire is being investigated now; however, the occupant who had just left the home had just been in the fire involved room using a clothes iron. The home suffered heavy fire damage to the involved room and the rest of the home had moderate smoke damage.
