Alert neighbor leads police to trio of burglars

Shreveport Police have three suspects, two adults and one juvenile, in custody on multiple counts of vehicle burglary stemming from an early morning burglary spree thanks to an alert neighbor.

On October 21, 2017 just after 6:00 am Shreveport Police patrol officers received reports of three suspicious persons walking down Cedar Creek Drive in Shreveport's Southern Hills Neighborhood. While officers were on the way, the witness observed the three subjects enter into a school bus that was parked at Southwood High School. Officers arrived and all three suspects fled on foot but were quickly taken into custody without incident. Officers entered the school bus and located a laptop, a large amount of coins and cash, and jewelry inside of the bus.

Investigators with the Shreveport police Department's Property Crimes Unit responded to the scene and throughout the day worked alongside patrol officers to identify where the stolen items were taken from and return the property its owners. Through their investigation, they developed information and evidence that tied all three subjects to multiple vehicle burglaries along Cedar Creek and the Seasons Apartments.

17-year-old Trey'Von Williams, of the 9000 block of Hilton Drive, was charged with nine counts of Simple Burglary, one count of Criminal Trespassing, and one count of Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor. 18-year-old Peter Jackson, of the 2900 block of Grassmere Street, was charged with nine counts of Simple Burglary, one count of Criminal Trespassing, and one count of contributing to the delinquency of a minor. A 15-year-old juvenile was also charged with nine counts of Simple Burglary and one count of Criminal Trespassing.

Investigators are asking residents of this part of Southern Hills to check their vehicles. They have numerous cell phones and other items for which they have not located the owners.
