One man injured, one killed in early morning shooting

Shreveport Police continue their investigation into an early morning shooting that left one man injured and another dead in west Shreveport.

On June 2, 2018 just before 1:00 am, Shreveport Police patrol officers responded to reports of a shooting at an apartment complex in the 7200 block of Bernstein Avenue. On arrival, police located 23 year old Savarea Stickman on the parking lot suffering from at least two gunshot wounds to the upper body. Stickman was transported to University Health Hospital where he later succumbed to his injuries. A short time later, officers received reports of a second shooting victim at the intersection of Wallace Street and West 75th Street. Officers and medics responded to that location and located a 17-year-old male suffering from a gunshot injury to his arm. He was also transported to University Health with what was described as non-life threatening injuries. He is expected to recover.

Detectives with the Violent Crimes and Crime Scene Units responded to the apartment complex and located the crime scene from which investigators recovered a firearm, a large amount of Marijuana, and shell casings from at least two different caliber weapons. Detectives worked through the night and day gathering information. Through their investigation detectives learned that the 17 year old victim and 23 year old Jacory Robinson, from Greenwood, La, arrived at the apartment complex just before the shooting so that Robinson could allegedly sell a large quantity of Marijuana to an individual whose identity remains unknown. During the drug transaction, Stickman reportedly began firing multiple shots at Robinson and the 17-year-old. Robinson returned fire, striking Stickman multiple times. Robinson, the 17-year-old, and Stickman all attempted to flee the scene on foot; however, Stickman and the 17 year old were both injured and unable to flee the area. Robinson fled back to his home in Greenwood, la where he was later contacted by Shreveport detectives and Greenwood Police officers. Following interviews, Robinson was booked into the Shreveport City Jail on one count of Conspiracy to Distribute Marijuana.

Earlier in the week investigators procured a warrant for Stickman charging him with one count of Cyberstalking. At this time investigators do not believe that the two incidents are connected.
