The Stewart-Warner Project Swim Fund is established at The Community Foundation to provide funding and resources to teach and educate all, particularly disadvantaged children, how to swim.

On August 2, 2010 Shreveport lost six of its children- Litrelle Stewart, Latevin Stewart, LaDarius Stewart, Takeitha Warner, JaMarcus Warner and JaTavious Warner. All drowned while trying to save a family member from the same fate in the Red River. The Stewart-Warner Project Swim Fund will be a collective effort and partnership of the area's public and private entities, with the goal of establishing resources that will provide for the project's mission:

"Stewart-Warner Project Swim is to provide anyone the opportunity to learn to swim and that opportunity not be limited due to socio-economic status or access to accommodating water facilities."
