Boil advisory could be lifted for most of the Shreveport as early as Friday

A boil advisory remains in effect for the City of Shreveport; however, significant progress was made today in repairing three of the damaged structures.

- St. Vincent water tower at the corner of Oakdale Street and St. Vincent Avenue
 - Repairs were completed this evening. The Department of Water and Sewerage received approval from the Louisiana Department of Health to proceed with a water sampling plan.

Lab collection staff will work through the night until all required samples have been collected.

Repairs for the West Shreveport elevated tank will begin at 7 a.m. Friday.

Earlier today, repairs were completed at the Linwood water tank and the elevated ground storage site at 70th and Pines Road.

With LDH approval, portions of the city could be lifted from the boil advisory late Friday Afternoon.
