**Proactive Shreveport Police Patrol Officers Arrest Two More Convicted Felons**

Proactive efforts by Shreveport Police Department patrol officers have led to the arrest of two more convicted felons, underscoring the department's commitment to public safety.

On May 24th at approximately 8 a.m., patrol officers arrested 36-year-old Kenneth Wells. Officers observed Wells acting suspiciously near the intersection of 71st Street and Cliff Avenue. Upon contact, Wells fled but was captured. Officers then discovered Wells was carrying a concealed handgun. Further investigation revealed that Wells is a convicted felon. He was promptly arrested and charged with the following offenses:

1. One count of being a convicted felon in possession of a firearm
2. One count of carrying a concealed weapon
3. One count of resisting an officer
4. One count of obstruction of a passage

On May 23rd at approximately 8 p.m., officers on patrol contacted a suspicious individual in the 1200 block of Murphy Street. As officers approached, the suspect attempted to flee but was apprehended shortly thereafter. The individual, identified as 28-year-old Levonte Morris, was found to be armed. Morris, also a convicted felon, was charged with the following offenses:

- One count of illegal carrying of a weapon
- One count of being a convicted felon in possession of a firearm
- One count of resisting an officer

These arrests highlight the Shreveport Police Department's ongoing efforts to maintain community safety and prevent crime through vigilant patrol activities.

Suspects are innocent until proven guilty.
