Council Members Applaud Administration's Commitment to Public Safety in Shreveport

SHREVEPORT, LA—Councilman James Green and Councilwoman Tabatha Taylor extend their heartfelt thanks to the voters for approving the 2021 Bond Proposition and Mayor Arceneaux and his administration for their decisive action in moving forward with initiatives to enhance public safety in Shreveport, specifically in Districts A and F. The recent approval for the solicitation of bids for the construction of two new Shreveport Police Department (SPD) substations marks a significant milestone in the city's ongoing efforts to combat crime and ensure the safety of its residents.

Councilman Green and Councilwoman Taylor, representing Districts A and F respectively, have long advocated for increased resources and infrastructure to support law enforcement in their communities. The planned substations on North Market Street and Monkhouse Drive will play a crucial role in optimizing police response times and enhancing community presence.

Councilman James Green remarked, "This is a pivotal moment for our districts. The construction of these substations will not only provide our police officers with the necessary tools and facilities to perform their duties more effectively but will also foster a greater sense of security and trust within our neighborhoods."

Councilwoman Tabatha Taylor echoed these sentiments, stating, "Our community has been eagerly awaiting this development. I am grateful to Mayor Arceneaux and his team for prioritizing public safety and for their commitment to seeing these projects through. These substations represent hope and progress for our residents."

The substations, funded by the 2021 Bond Proposition, each have an allocated budget of 1.5 million dollars for construction. The City of Shreveport is actively seeking a location and the requisite funds for a third substation, also included in the 2021 Bond Proposition.

In addition to the advancements in public safety infrastructure, next week the City of Shreveport will launch a newly updated, user-friendly website. This new platform will include a dashboard where citizens can track the status of all capital projects, providing greater transparency and engagement in the city's developmental initiatives.

Councilman Green and Councilwoman Taylor encourage all citizens to stay informed and involved in these positive changes, as Shreveport continues to strive toward a safer and more connected community.
