Shreveport Police Patrol Officers Remove Guns from the Hands of Criminals



The Shreveport Police Department continues its relentless efforts to reduce gun violence and ensure community safety. Over the past few days, SPD Patrol Officers have successfully arrested multiple individuals and confiscated illegal firearms during routine traffic stops and investigations.

November 28 - December 1, 2024 - Arrests Include:

- Jzarmacio Whitehead (32): Arrested on November 30, just after midnight, near Greenbriar Drive and Lyba Street. Whitehead, a convicted felon, was found with a stolen firearm and attempted to flee from officers. He faces multiple charges, including possession of a stolen firearm and felon in possession of a firearm.
- Tauris Willis (46): Arrested during a separate traffic stop on November 30 for illegal possession of a stolen firearm.
- Randy Thomas (30): Taken into custody on November 29 at approximately 11:50 PM near Quilen Boulevard and Meadow Avenue. Thomas was found with a firearm and narcotics. He is a convicted felon with a 2028 aggravated battery conviction and faces charges related to firearm possession and narcotics offenses.
- Tommy Harley (33): Arrested following a traffic stop at Terry Bradshaw Passway and Bert

Kouns Industrial Loop. Harley, a convicted felon with multiple outstanding warrants, was in possession of a firearm.

- Donald Jackson (21): Apprehended on November 29 at the 5800 block of Ledbetter. Jackson, a felon stemming from a 2021 shooting conviction, was charged with felon in possession of a firearm.
- Earl Dixon (33): Arrested following a traffic stop at Spring Street and Caddo Street. Dixon, a convicted felon, was found to be unlawfully carrying a firearm.
- Dandrew Anderson (27): Arrested on November 28 during an armed robbery investigation in the 800 block of Pierre Avenue. Anderson, a convicted felon, was charged with illegal use of a weapon, narcotics offenses, and possession of a firearm by a felon.

All firearms recovered in these incidents have been seized and will be destroyed.
