Shreveport Police Officers Arrest Two Suspects Following High-Speed Pursuits

On Saturday, February 1, 2025, Shreveport Police officers successfully apprehended two individuals following two separate high-speed pursuits through the city. Both suspects endangered the community by recklessly fleeing from law enforcement, ignoring traffic laws, and placing innocent citizens at risk.

Incident 1: Hollywood Avenue Pursuit

At approximately 11:24 PM, officers attempted to stop a Chrysler 300 near Hollywood Avenue and Jewella Avenue due to a switched Louisiana temporary tag. The driver of the vehicle refused to comply with emergency lights and sirens, instead accelerating to over 80 MPH on Hearne Avenue, where the posted speed limit is 40 MPH. The suspect, later identified as Caterry Winbush, ran a red light at Hearne Avenue and Midway Avenue, drove northbound in the southbound lane, and continued west on Fulton Street, reaching speeds of over 70 MPH in a 25 MPH zone. Winbush also disregarded multiple stop signs before losing control and crashing into a wooden fence.

After the crash, Winbush fled on foot, jumping over a residential fence. Officers pursued and deployed a departmental issued taser to gain compliance. Winbush surrendered and was taken into

custody without further incident.

He was booked on the following charges:

- Switched Tag
- Aggravated Flight
- Possession of Schedule I (Marijuana - Misdemeanor)
- Resisting an Officer

Incident 2: Youree Drive Pursuit

At approximately 1:17 AM, the Shreveport Police Department's DWI Task Force, in conjunction with the SPD Traffic Enforcement Unit, attempted a traffic stop in the 6500 block of Youree Drive. Officers observed a white BMW run a solid red light at the intersection of Youree Drive and Gator Drive while traveling 96 MPH in a 40 MPH zone.

Upon initiating emergency lights and sirens, officers observed the suspect driving on the wrong side of the roadway before stopping at Southfield Road and East Kings Highway. When ordered to exit the vehicle, the driver, later identified as Zachary Boulton, refused to comply and instead fled at high speed, running another red light and recklessly weaving through residential neighborhoods, disregarding multiple stop signs.

Boulton continued his flight, nearly sideswiping a gray pickup truck on Youree Drive before turning onto Pierremont Road. He struck multiple curbs and veered off the roadway several times before his front driver-side tire was disabled after hitting another curb. The pursuit ended at Fairfield Avenue and Ockley Drive, where Boulton exited the vehicle and attempted to flee on foot. Officers quickly apprehended him without further incident.

Boulton was charged with the following offenses:

- Aggravated Flight
- Reckless Operation
- Multiple Traffic Violations

Fleeing from law enforcement is an extremely dangerous act that not only endangers the suspect but also officers and innocent civilians. The Shreveport Police Department remains steadfast in its commitment to ensuring public safety and holding reckless individuals accountable.

We commend the officers involved for their swift and professional response in safely bringing these individuals into custody. The SPD will continue to enforce the law to keep our streets safe.
