Essay Writing Competition: Honoring Women Who Inspire

Students in grades 9-12 are invited to participate in an **Essay Writing Competition** that challenges them to reflect on the role of women in their lives and history. Participants can choose from two themes:

1. **The Power of Role Models** – Writing about a woman who has personally inspired them.
2. **Unsung Heroines** – Highlighting a woman in history who has made a significant impact.

Essays should be no longer than 300 words and will be judged on originality, clarity, structure, and relevance to the theme. Submissions are due by **February 28, 2025, at 5:00 PM** and should be emailed to R.J.Johnson@ShreveportLA.gov with the subject line “Essay Contest.”

Winners will be recognized at the **March 11th Shreveport City Council Chamber Pink Out Event**, during a press conference at **2:00 PM**, followed by a **Council Recognition Ceremony at 3:00 PM**.
