

Another Pedestrian Struck on Interstate 20

At approximately 6:11 p.m. on March 7, 2025, Shreveport Police officers responded to a report of a woman walking on I-20 westbound near Hearne Avenue. Before officers could arrive, the woman was struck by the side mirror of a passing vehicle.

The woman sustained critical injuries and was transported to a local hospital, where she remains in serious condition.

The Shreveport Police Department urges the public to understand that interstates are not designed for pedestrian traffic. Walking on the interstate, including the shoulder or neutral ground, is not only illegal but also extremely dangerous. This incident serves as a tragic reminder of the risks involved.

We ask for the community's help in preventing these senseless and avoidable incidents. If you see someone walking on the interstate, please contact police immediately. If you experience car trouble on the interstate, stay inside your vehicle and call for assistance. Together, we can work to keep everyone safe.
