Shreveport Man Arrested for Domestic Abuse Battery with Serious Injury

On March 11, 2025, at approximately 4:30 p.m., Shreveport Police officers responded to a residence in the 2800 block of Westover Road regarding a domestic disturbance involving physical violence.

Upon arrival, officers made contact with the victim, who was seated on the front porch of the home. The victim reported that she had attempted to pick up her 11-year-old son from his father, Travez Clark (07/20/1991), at his residence on South Greenbrook Loop. She stated that during the encounter, Clark exited the home and physically assaulted her by pushing her, grabbing her by the neck with both hands, and forcefully slamming her head into a fence rail.

Officers observed visible injuries on the victim, including a bruise on the bridge of her nose and a red scratch on her neck and collarbone. During their investigation, officers located a surveillance camera pointed toward the area where the incident occurred. Upon reviewing the footage, officers observed Clark physically assaulting the victim and slamming her head into the fence rail at approximately 12:56 p.m.

The victim was later contacted at a local hospital, where medical staff confirmed she had suffered a nasal bone fracture, subdural bleeding, and subarachnoid bleeding in her brain.

Clark was taken into custody and charged with Domestic Abuse Battery with a Dangerous Weapon Involving Serious Bodily Injury. Additionally, officers discovered Clark had an outstanding warrant for Contempt of Court.

The Shreveport Police Department remains committed to holding offenders accountable for acts of domestic violence and urges anyone experiencing abuse to seek help.
