## SPD Responds to Two Domestic Violence Incidents, Makes Multiple Arrests

The Shreveport Police Department responded to two separate domestic violence incidents, resulting in the arrests of two individuals with multiple outstanding warrants.

On March 13, 2025, officers responded to 840 Huntington Lane regarding a domestic battery complaint. A female victim reported that her live-in child's father, Lee Quinton Bryant, physically assaulted her during a verbal altercation by striking her with a closed fist in the right leg/knee area, causing instant bruising.

Investigators determined that the victim had an active protection order against Bryant. However, she allowed him to continue residing at the residence. Bryant was arrested and charged with violating a protective order, domestic battery, and seven outstanding warrants.

In a separate incident on March 14, 2025, at approximately 1:00 AM, officers were dispatched to 5329 Avon Avenue for a reported assault and battery. Upon arrival, officers spoke with the victim, who stated that her brother, Eric Hughes, struck her in the leg with a wooden chair leg, causing a bleeding wound.

Officers located Hughes in the area and attempted to make contact, but he fled. After a brief pursuit, officers successfully apprehended him using a department-issued Taser. Hughes was arrested and charged with one count of resisting an officer and one count of aggravated battery with a dangerous weapon. He was also found to have five outstanding warrants.
