## SPD Continues to Highlight Domestic Violence in Effort to Help Victims

### ONE Arrested, ONE WANTED

The Shreveport Police Department remains committed to bringing awareness to domestic violence situations, in hopes that more victims will take steps to escape these dangerous environments.

On March 12, 2025, just after 7:15 p.m., Shreveport police officers responded to the 3200 block of Old Blanchard Road regarding a domestic disturbance. Upon arrival, officers located a male victim and his six-month-old son. An investigation revealed that Khari Lacour arrived at the location and was seen intentionally ramming her vehicle into the victim's parked vehicle, causing significant damage. When the victim exited his vehicle, Lacour physically attacked him. It was also discovered that the six-month-old child was inside the victim's vehicle when it was struck. Lacour has been charged with domestic abuse battery, domestic abuse battery with child endangerment, and cruelty to a juvenile.

In a separate case, Shreveport police are currently searching for Christopher Curlee in connection to a domestic violence incident that occurred on February 19, 2025, in the 700 block of East 71st Street. Officers responded after the victim arrived at a local hospital reporting she had been assaulted by her boyfriend. The investigation determined that the victim suffered injuries to her neck and lost consciousness during the attack. Curlee is now wanted for one count of domestic abuse battery by strangulation. He has also been arrested four previous times for domestic-related offenses.

The Shreveport Police Department encourages all victims of domestic violence to seek help and reminds the community that support resources are available. If you or someone you know is in a domestic violence situation, please reach out to law enforcement or a local advocacy organization.
