## Stolen Vehicle Pursuit Ends in Arrests Thanks to SPD K-9 Officer



On Sunday, April 20, just after 6:20 p.m., Shreveport Police K-9 Officer Edy was patrolling the 6500 block of Kennedy Street in response to ongoing complaints of drag racing in the area. While on patrol, K-9 Edy's partner observed a stolen Dodge Durango and attempted to conduct a traffic stop.

The vehicle fled from officers, initiating a pursuit that ultimately ended near the intersection of Missouri Avenue and Greenwood Road. The chase came to a halt when the suspect vehicle crashed into several trees and the fence of Shreveport Fire Department Station 8.

Following the crash, the driver and multiple passengers fled on foot. K-9 Edy was deployed and successfully tracked down the driver after a short chase. The suspect, identified as Darr'tavious Lewis, was taken into custody by K-9 Edy.

Two additional suspects, Darryl Thomas and Keeley Duncan, were apprehended by Shreveport Police patrol officers. A fourth occupant, a 15-year-old juvenile, was also captured.

The Dodge Durango was confirmed to have been reported stolen out of Longview, Texas, on April 19, 2025.

Lewis was transported to a local hospital for treatment of minor injuries sustained during his resistance. He now faces multiple charges, including aggravated flight, illegal possession of a stolen vehicle, and additional offenses related to the incident. The remaining individuals were charged with resisting an officer and were issued summonses for a later court appearance.

The Shreveport Police Department commends the efforts of K-9 Edy and all officers involved for their swift and professional response.
