Shreveport Police Continue Efforts to Get Guns Off the Streets

Shreveport Police remain committed to removing illegal firearms from our community and keeping them out of the hands of convicted felons.

On May 25, just after 9:30 p.m., officers with the Directed Patrol Unit conducted a traffic stop that led to the arrest of Nicholas Bryant and Devon Price. Both individuals were found armed inside the vehicle and were determined to be convicted felons. Bryant had a prior conviction for aggravated assault with a firearm in 2023, while Price had a 2021 conviction for possession of a stolen firearm.

Earlier that week, on May 23, officers executed a search warrant that resulted in the arrest of Lakisha Fisher. During the search, officers recovered a large quantity of narcotics and a firearm. Fisher now faces charges related to the production, manufacturing, and distribution of narcotics, as well as the illegal carrying of a weapon.

The department's efforts didn't stop there. On May 25, just before 1:00 a.m., officers arrested James Hampton during a separate traffic stop. Hampton was found to be in possession of a handgun and was confirmed to be a convicted felon due to a 2024 conviction for possession of a stolen firearm.

These arrests highlight the continued work of Shreveport Police to reduce gun violence and protect our neighborhoods by holding offenders accountable.
