Shreveport Police Continue Efforts to Combat Domestic Violence



The Shreveport Police Department continues to see a troubling rise in domestic violence-related incidents. Over the weekend, officers made several arrests involving domestic abuse—highlighting just how pervasive and dangerous these situations have become.

On July 24, officers arrested Hury Spencer for one count of *Domestic Abuse Battery* along with other criminal charges after locating him inside a local business where he was reportedly committing additional offenses.

On July 25, two individuals were taken into custody for domestic-related offenses:

- Tranon Johns was arrested for one count of *Simple Battery of a Dating Partner*.
- Jacori Johnson was arrested for one count of *Domestic Abuse Battery of a Pregnant Victim*. Crimes involving pregnant victims carry enhanced penalties due to the heightened risk to both the victim and the unborn child.

- Martis West was arrested for Domestic abuse Battery and charged with resisting an officer during a violent domestic incident.

On July 26, officers made three additional arrests:

- Eric Mendoza was taken into custody for violating a restraining order related to a domestic violence case.
- Curtis Clark was arrested for *Domestic Abuse Battery with Child Endangerment* after he too was found in violation of a restraining order.
- Gregory Hill was arrested on multiple charges including *Domestic Abuse Battery, Interference with a 911 Call*, and two counts of *Resisting an Officer* during a domestic violence investigation.

On July 27, Shmoyia Adams was arrested for *Simple Battery of a Dating Partner*.

On July 28, officers arrested Shatorian Watson for a disturbing series of offenses, including:

- Four counts of *Domestic Abuse Battery of a Dating Partner with Child Endangerment*
- Three counts of *Aggravated Assault with a Weapon*
- One count of *Simple Battery of a Dating Partner*

Each of these incidents is serious and potentially life-threatening. Domestic violence continues to be one of the most common—and most dangerous—calls for service that our officers respond to.

The Shreveport Police Department urges the community to recognize the growing impact domestic violence is having on our city. These acts often escalate and can have devastating consequences for victims, children, and entire families.
