Shreveport Police Continue Efforts to Get Illegally Possessed Guns Off the Streets

The Shreveport Police Department remains committed to removing illegally possessed firearms from our streets—especially from those prohibited by law from owning them. Since taking office, Chief Wayne Smith has made this a top priority, and the results speak for themselves. There's been a noticeable reduction in violent crime that correlates directly with the number of illegally possessed firearms seized by officers.

On July 27th, officers arrested Dakota Davis during a traffic stop after he was found in possession of both a firearm and narcotics. He now faces charges related to the illegal possession of a firearm in connection with controlled dangerous substances, as well as other narcotics offenses.

On July 28th, a separate traffic stop led to the arrest of Undray Joyce and Bobby Joyce. Bobby Joyce was found to be in possession of a firearm and, through further investigation, determined to be a convicted felon with prior firearm-related charges. This marks his third arrest involving illegally possessed firearms. Undray Joyce was arrested on outstanding warrants.

Additionally, in the early morning hours today, SPD Warrant Units and VCAT members arrested Jordan Fuggins on an outstanding warrant for one count of illegal carrying of a weapon. During the arrest, Shakira Fuggins was also taken into custody for resisting an officer and obstruction of justice after she attempted to interfere with officers trying to locate Jordan.

These arrests highlight the ongoing work of the men and women of the Shreveport Police Department in preventing violent crime and making our community safer—one illegally possessed firearm at a time.
