Shreveport Police Arrest Wanted Felon Following Pursuit

The Shreveport Police Department arrested a man who went to extraordinary lengths to avoid capture Sunday evening, putting the lives of officers and members of the public in danger.

Just before 8:00 p.m., patrol officers attempted to conduct a traffic stop on Marvaeya Anderson. Rather than complying, Anderson chose to flee from law enforcement. During the pursuit, he rammed a Shreveport Police vehicle in a reckless attempt to escape. He later abandoned his vehicle and fled on foot before barricading himself inside an abandoned building located on Pro Street.

Officers quickly established a perimeter and demonstrated remarkable bravery as they entered the structure and pursued Anderson, who was ultimately taken into custody without further incident. Their courage and teamwork ensured that this dangerous situation ended safely for both officers and the community.

Following his arrest, investigators discovered that Anderson was already wanted on three felony warrants, including one for sexual assault. A search revealed he was in possession of approximately 300 grams of suspected methamphetamine and crack cocaine, as well as a firearm. Further investigation determined that Anderson was prohibited from possessing any firearms due to previous convictions for illegal use of a weapon and aggravated second-degree battery.

Anderson now faces multiple new charges, including:

- Flight from an officer
- Possession with intent to distribute narcotics
- Felon in possession of a firearm
- In addition to his existing felony warrants

Chief Wayne Smith and the leadership of the Shreveport Police Department commend the officers involved for their professionalism, bravery, and commitment to protecting the citizens of Shreveport. Their actions exemplify the courage it takes to wear the badge and face dangerous situations head-on.

The Shreveport Police Department condemns all acts of violence, criminal behavior, and disregard for the law. Those who choose to endanger the lives of our officers and community will be held accountable to the fullest extent.

This arrest represents another example of the dedicated men and women of the Shreveport Police Department working tirelessly to keep our city safe and free from those who threaten public peace and safety.
