## Domestic Violence Arrests Continue as SPD Cracks Down During Awareness Month



### Christopher Browder, Frankie Clark, Rondicious Davis, & Timothy Stewart

As Domestic Violence Awareness Month continues, the Shreveport Police Department remains committed to aggressively investigating and arresting those involved in domestic-related crimes.

On October 18, officers arrested Christopher Browder during the early morning hours. Browder has been charged with Aggravated Assault with a Firearm, Possession of a Firearm by a Convicted Felon, Domestic Abuse Battery, and three counts of Domestic Abuse Battery with Child Endangerment. Officers responded to a domestic disturbance in which Browder was reportedly armed. He was safely taken into custody and booked into the Shreveport City Jail.

Also on October 18, officers arrested Frankie Clark, who has been charged with six counts of Domestic Abuse Battery with Child Endangerment, one count of False Imprisonment, and one count of Violation of a Protective Order. These types of cases are extremely dangerous, and we are grateful our officers were able to apprehend Clark before tragedy could occur.

On October 19, just after 1:00 p.m., Rondicious Davis was arrested and charged with Domestic Abuse Battery and Domestic Abuse Battery with Child Endangerment.

Later that same day, around 11:00 a.m., officers conducted a traffic stop and encountered Timothy Stewart. Stewart was found to have eight outstanding warrants and to be in possession of a firearm. Further investigation revealed Stewart's prior felony domestic violence convictions, which prohibit him from legally possessing a firearm. He was charged with Possession of a Firearm by an Individual Convicted of Domestic Abuse Battery.

The Shreveport Police Department will continue to prioritize domestic violence investigations and enforcement efforts to protect victims and reduce the number of families affected by these dangerous crimes.
