## SPD Continues Efforts to Remove Firearms from the Hands of Convicted Felons

The Shreveport Police Department continues its ongoing efforts to remove firearms from the hands of individuals prohibited from possessing them. Over the past week, several arrests were made as part of the department's focused initiative to reduce gun-related violence in our community.

On October 22, 2025, officers conducted a traffic stop that resulted in the arrest of Tyrone Winslow. During the stop, officers discovered that Winslow had multiple traffic violations and outstanding warrants. Further investigation revealed he was in possession of narcotics and a firearm. Officers determined that Winslow was prohibited from possessing a firearm due to previous felony convictions for burglary, narcotics, and firearm-related offenses. Winslow now faces multiple charges including Possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, Possession of Schedule II narcotics, Obstruction of justice, Operating a vehicle with a suspended license and, Multiple other traffic offenses.

Later that same day, at approximately 1:30 p.m., members of the Violent Crimes Abatement Team (VCAT) were conducting field contacts in known areas of firearm activity when they encountered Tyre Clark at a grocery store located in the 300 block of Pierre Avenue. Clark fled on foot but was quickly apprehended after discarding a loaded firearm. He was also found to be in possession of crack cocaine and marijuana. Clark has been charged with Possession of a firearm by a person convicted of domestic violence by strangulation, Illegal carrying of a weapon with a controlled dangerous substance, and Possession of Schedule II narcotics.

In a separate incident on October 22, Street Level Interdiction Unit agents executed a search warrant related to narcotics and firearm trafficking. Buford Edwards was taken into custody after being found in possession of and distributing Schedule I and Schedule II narcotics. Edwards was also found to be in possession of a firearm. Due to prior felony convictions for narcotics and property crimes, Edwards is prohibited from possessing firearms. He was arrested and charged accordingly.

On October 20, Street Level Interdiction Unit agents arrested Rodmango McNeil during a follow-up investigation. McNeil was found to be in possession of a firearm despite having a 2020 conviction for firearm-related offenses. He has been charged with one count of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon.

The Shreveport Police Department remains committed to protecting our community and will continue to pursue individuals who unlawfully possess firearms. Our officers work tirelessly to ensure that those who seek to commit acts of violence are held accountable.
