

## FELONS WITH FIREARMS ARRESTED

The Shreveport Police Department remains committed to removing firearms from the hands of individuals who are prohibited from possessing them.

In the early morning hours of December 3rd, officers responded to a domestic violence call in the 5100 block of Monkhouse Drive. While en route, officers also heard a gunshot in the area. Upon arrival, officers took into custody. Taylor was charged with one count of Illegal Use of a Weapon and one count of Possession of a Firearm by a Convicted Felon. A review of his criminal history revealed previous convictions for Aggravated Flight from an Officer, Simple Burglary, and a prior conviction for Felon in Possession of a Firearm.

At approximately 1400 hours on December 2, 2025, members of the Shreveport City Marshal's Office, the Shreveport Police Department's Warrants Unit, and VCAT arrived at 3430 Frederick Street to execute an arrest warrant for (DOB 04/05/02).

During the arrest, officers discovered narcotics and a firearm that had been illegally modified to fire fully automatic. Further investigation confirmed that Robertson is a convicted felon due to prior charges, including felony theft and Aggravated Assault on a Police Officer.

Robertson now faces charges including Possession of a Firearm by a Convicted Felon, Possession of a Machine Gun, and multiple narcotics-related offenses. The Shreveport Police Department will continue to do everything we can to hold violent offenders accountable. Felons in possession of firearms pose a serious threat to the safety of our community, and our officers remain dedicated to reducing that danger.
