Domestic Violence Arrests – Weekend Enforcement



Over the course of the weekend, the Shreveport Police Department continued its focused efforts to address domestic violence incidents impacting members of our community. Domestic violence is a cancer that affects every segment of society, and the Shreveport Police Department remains committed to intervening, holding offenders accountable, and protecting victims—especially children.

The following arrests were made in connection with domestic violence-related incidents:

January 16, just after 2:00 p.m.

Joshua Wiggins was arrested for one count of Domestic Abuse Battery.

January 17, at approximately 2:40 a.m.

Steven Rigsby was arrested for one count of Battery of a Dating Partner.

January 17, at approximately 9:20 p.m.

Tynell Lloyd was arrested for one count of Battery of a Dating Partner and two counts of Battery of a Dating Partner with Child Endangerment, indicating the offenses occurred in the presence of young children.

January 17, just after 9:30 p.m.

Jenny Reed was arrested for two counts of Domestic Abuse Battery.

January 18, at approximately 10:00 p.m.

Officers responded to a domestic disturbance in the 6700 block of Buncombe Road. Upon arrival, Courtney Gilliam was found suffering from a stab wound, and Titana Glover was found to be in possession of the knife. Following an investigation, both individuals were arrested for their respective roles in the incident.

Courtney Gilliam was arrested and charged with two counts of Domestic Abuse Child Endangerment and one count of Domestic Abuse Battery.

Titana Glover was arrested and charged with Domestic Abuse Battery with a Dangerous Weapon.

January 19

Deandra Sloan was arrested for one count of Domestic Abuse Battery and one count of Domestic Abuse Battery with Child Endangerment.
