**City of Shreveport to Remain Closed
Tuesday, January 27 Due to Winter Weather**

Due to ongoing winter weather conditions and continued concerns about road safety, City of Shreveport offices will remain closed on Tuesday, January 27.

City leadership continues to closely monitor conditions and remains in communication with parish, state, and utility partners. Essential personnel will remain on duty to support public safety and critical operations.

“While conditions are improving, temperatures and roadways remain unreliable,” said Mayor Tom Arceneaux. “Keeping City offices closed Tuesday allows us to prioritize public safety while giving crews time to assess conditions and prepare to safely resume normal operations.”

Council Chair Tabatha H. Taylor has cancelled the City Council meeting previously scheduled for Tuesday, January 27.

Garbage Collection Update

Monday’s garbage collection was suspended due to weather conditions. Public Works crews are preparing to resume service as soon as it is safe to do so. Garbage collection is expected to resume Wednesday as follows:

Wednesday 1/28: Monday’s garbage will be collected

Thursday 1/29: Tuesday’s garbage will be collected

Friday 1/30: Thursday's garbage will be collected

Saturday 1/31: Friday's garbage will be collected

Because garbage collection may be slower than usual due to road conditions, crews may not get to every household on the days listed above. The City asks citizens to be patient as crews catch up with garbage collection.

The City of Shreveport will continue to provide updates through official communication channels as conditions change.

Residents are urged to limit travel unless absolutely necessary and to take appropriate precautions during freezing conditions. The City is coordinating with local and state partners to respond to the storm and address impacts as conditions allow.

The City reminds residents to:

- Avoid icy roads and bridges, which may freeze before other surfaces
- Check on elderly neighbors and those without adequate heat
- Use space heaters safely and never leave them unattended
- Follow updates from local emergency management and utility providers
