Shreveport Police Seek Suspect in Second Degree Battery

Update: An arrest has been made in this case. Due to the offender being a juvenile, the photo will be removed. In accordance with policy, juvenile photos are taken down once the individual is no longer considered a danger to the public.

On January 15, 2026, at approximately 9:14 a.m., Shreveport Police Department Uniform Patrol Officers were dispatched to the 9900 block of Loveland Court in reference to an Assault and Battery that occurred on December 23, 2025, at approximately 11:00 p.m.

The victim reported an unprovoked physical assault. According to the victim, he was outside the residence of a friend when she informed him that her ex-boyfriend was on his way and advised him to leave. The victim complied and began walking home with his friend.

While walking, a dark-colored pickup truck drove onto the street and stopped behind them. A male, later identified as Kaden Boyd, exited the vehicle and began striking the victim multiple times with a closed fist. The victim reported Boyd then lifted him and slammed him onto the ground. While on the ground, the victim stated he was repeatedly kicked and punched before Boyd returned to the vehicle and fled the area.

On February 9, 2026, the victim provided a follow-up statement consistent with his original account. Medical documentation confirmed the victim sustained significant injuries as a result of the assault.

Through investigative efforts, detectives were able to identify the suspect using departmental records. Attempts to contact Boyd's guardian have been unsuccessful.

On February 11, 2026, an Order to Take Into Custody (OTTIC) was signed for Kaden Boyd for his involvement in Second Degree Battery in connection with this case.
