Shreveport Police Continue Enforcement Efforts Against Domestic Violence



The Shreveport Police Department remains committed to aggressively addressing domestic violence in our community and holding offenders accountable.

On February 16, 2026, just before 6:00 p.m., Shreveport Police officers responded to a reported domestic incident. Following their investigation, officers arrested Stephen Moore. Moore has been charged with Domestic Abuse Battery with Child Endangerment.

On February 18, 2026, at approximately 9:00 p.m., officers made a second arrest in a separate domestic violence case. Kevin Harris was taken into custody and is now facing four counts of Domestic Abuse Battery with Child Endangerment.

Under Louisiana law, domestic abuse battery child endangerment applies when a minor child thirteen years of age or younger is present at a residence or any other location during the commission of a domestic abuse battery. Domestic abuse battery is defined as the intentional use of force or violence committed by one household member or family member against another household or family member.

Domestic violence incidents have lasting impacts not only on victims but also on children who witness these acts. The presence of children during acts of violence increases the seriousness of these offenses and the harm inflicted on families.

The Shreveport Police Department will continue working to protect victims, intervene swiftly, and pursue charges when violence occurs inside the home.
