## Arrest Made in River Parkway Home Invasion and Domestic Violence Incident

On Saturday, February 21, 2026, at approximately 6:46 a.m., officers with the Shreveport Police Department's Uniform Services Division responded to a reported burglary/home invasion at the Riverscape Apartment Community, located in the 1500 block of River Parkway Boulevard.

A neighboring resident initially contacted dispatch, reporting that an individual had kicked in the door of an apartment. Shortly thereafter, the victim also contacted authorities and identified the suspect as her child's father, Darnell Harrison (DOB: June 10, 1997), stating he had forced entry into her residence and assaulted her.

Responding officers arrived on scene, secured the location, and observed damage consistent with forced entry to the apartment door. Officers learned the suspect had fled prior to their arrival. The victim reported she was inside the apartment with a friend when the incident occurred. During the confrontation, Harrison allegedly struck the friend multiple times with a firearm before turning his attention to the victim.

Investigators obtained surveillance footage from a neighboring residence that showed a subject kicking in the victim's apartment door. Officers later located Harrison and conducted an interview. At the conclusion of the investigation, Harrison was taken into custody without incident.

Darnell Harrison has been charged with the following:

Home Invasion (La. R.S. 14:62.8) – Felony, Domestic Abuse Battery (La. R.S. 14:35.3) – Misdemeanor,  
Domestic Abuse Aggravated Assault (La. R.S. 14:37.7), Simple Robbery (La. R.S. 14:65)

Harrison was transported to the Caddo Correctional Center, where he was booked on the above charges.
