**Shreveport City Council Leadership Welcomes Amazon's \$12 Billion Data Center Investment**

**Shreveport, LA** – On behalf of the Shreveport City Council, council leadership proudly welcomes Amazon's announcement of a historic \$12 billion investment to construct new, state-of-the-art data center campuses across Caddo and Bossier Parishes. The coordinated, multi-site development will establish Amazon's first data center campuses in Northwest Louisiana and further position the region as a growing hub for technology and innovation. This investment will mark the third Amazon facility in the City of Shreveport, reflecting the company's continued confidence in our community.

The project is expected to create 540 new direct on-site jobs with wages at or above 150 percent of the statewide annual average wage, while supporting an additional 1,700 indirect jobs throughout the region. Construction is anticipated to begin in the coming weeks.

Council Chairwoman Tabatha Taylor, whose district is home to Amazon's Shreveport fulfillment center, praised the company's continued confidence in the city.

"This announcement reflects Amazon's ongoing commitment to Shreveport and to Northwest Louisiana," said Chairwoman Taylor. "Our community has already seen the positive economic impact of the fulfillment center located in my district. With this project marking the third Amazon facility in our city, it is clear that Shreveport delivers results. It means high-paying jobs for our residents, strengthened infrastructure, and long-term economic growth that will benefit families across our city."

Council Vice Chairman Ursula Bowman, whose district is home to Amazon's last-mile delivery facility and will also house a portion of the new data center investment, emphasized the broader significance of the announcement.

"This continued expansion shows that major global companies see long-term value in Shreveport," said Vice Chairman Bowman. "With the last-mile facility already operating in my district, we have seen firsthand how strategic investment can energize a community. The addition of this data center campus positions us for the future, supporting innovation, increasing revenue for essential services, and creating meaningful career opportunities for our residents. This is the kind of growth that strengthens our resolve and moves our entire city forward."

Council leadership also recognized the collaboration among local, parish, regional, and state partners that made the project possible, including the City of Shreveport, Caddo and Bossier Parishes, NLEP, LED and other economic development organizations, and utility partners.

As demand for digital infrastructure accelerates nationwide, this multi-campus investment across both sides of the Red River reinforces Shreveport's role as a competitive destination for innovation, reliable power, and a skilled workforce.

The Shreveport City Council looks forward to continued partnership with Amazon, regional stakeholders, and community leaders to ensure this transformative investment delivers lasting opportunity and prosperity for the citizens of Shreveport and Northwest Louisiana.
