Shreveport Police Investigate Domestic Violence Incident Resulting in Serious Injuries

On March 19, 2026, at approximately 12:40 a.m., officers with the Shreveport Police Department were dispatched to Willis-Knighton South (2510 Bert Kouns Industrial Loop) in reference to a female who had sustained severe lacerations.

Upon arrival, officers made contact with medical staff and the victim, who was being treated in the emergency room for significant injuries. Medical personnel observed heavy bleeding from the left side of her neck. Officers also noted a deep laceration extending through the skin to the muscle at the base of her neck, as well as an additional deep wound to her left shoulder.

During the investigation, the victim reported that she had been involved in a physical altercation with her ex-boyfriend, identified as Leonard Jake-Frank Moran. The victim advised that Moran had come to her residence earlier in the evening, where the two became involved in a verbal dispute. After initially leaving, Moran returned to the residence under the pretense of needing assistance following a vehicle accident.

Once inside, Moran allegedly became aggressive, damaged the victim's cellular phone, and continued the confrontation. During the incident, Moran reportedly grabbed a glass bottle and struck the victim, causing it to shatter and resulting in the severe injuries. While officers were interviewing the victim at the hospital, Moran contacted Shreveport Police dispatch to report a vehicle accident and was later located at his residence in the 2800 block of Logan Street.

As a result of the investigation, Leonard Jake-Frank Moran has been charged with:

- **Domestic Abuse Battery with a Dangerous Weapon & Felony Criminal Damage to Property**

This incident remains under investigation.
