Shreveport Police investigate series of weekend shootings

Shreveport Police investigators are working a number of shootings over the weekend which sent four people to area hospitals, claiming the life of one of the victims. The first incident occurred just after 2:00 a.m. on July 17, in the 4000 block of Golf Links Boulevard where officers were advised 27 year old Timmie Lane had been shot by a suspect armed with a handgun and wearing a mask over his face. It is believed the suspect fired multiple shots at Lane, who was sitting inside his vehicle at the time. Lane was subsequently struck by the fired rounds, and later drove himself to Willis-Knighton Medical Center's north location after suffering a gunshot wound to the upper body. Lane's injuries were not considered life threatening, and he is expected to recover. Authorities are still seeking the suspect in the shooting.

Investigators were notified of a second shooting around 2:30 am. on July 17, which reportedly occurred in the 100 block of North Greenbrook Loop in west Shreveport. Patrol officers were present at University Health hospital when the victim, 35 year old Kevin White arrived in the emergency room suffering a gunshot wound to the mouth. White was immediately taken to surgery with injuries considered to be life-threatening. Information was gathered that White may have been shot at the Greenbrook Loop home and driven to the hospital by private vehicle. It was learned that just before 3:00 p.m. on July 18, White succumbed to his injuries. At current, no suspects have been arrested in connection with the deadly shooting, which is now an active homicide investigation.

Officers responded to a third shooting involving a local teen which authorities believe occurred at Lee Hedges Stadium in the 6000 block of Kings Highway around 6:15 p.m. on July 17, 2016. Officers located the injured 17 year old white male, who reportedly drove from the stadium, to the intersection of Southfield Road at Youree Drive after suffering a gunshot wound to the upper body. In investigator's probe of the incident, it was learned that the victim and another male, were allegedly engaged in the sale of illegal narcotics when a dispute between he and another man ensued. It is believed at that time, the teen was shot. The suspect in the incident fled the scene; however authorities are confident the arrest of a suspect in the matter is imminent.

In a fourth shooting, occurring shortly after 10:30 p.m. on July 17, 2016, officers responded to the emergency room of University Health where they contacted a 31 year old female who advised that while sitting outside a home in the 2800 block Hardy Street, she was shot by suspects who fired shots from a moving vehicle. Very little information was obtained regarding the description of the suspects vehicle. The victim, who suffered a non life-threatening gunshot wound to the thigh, arrived at the hospital by way of private auto.
