Mayor Tyler thanked the Council members who attended the event on Saturday, It's Everyone's Concern: A Conversation on Crime and Violence. The affair was held at Southwood High School where more than 300 people were in attendance. She also announced that the Shreveport Police Department was selected for a \$1million Byrne Criminal Justice Innovation (BCJI) grants given by the Office of Justice Programs at the U.S. Department of Justice. The funds will begin being released January 1, 2017. The Mayor reported that in FY 16 grants were awarded under

two categories – 1) Implementation only and 2) combined Planning and Implementation. All BCJI sites engage in a *planning phase* - along with community residents, a research partner and cross sector partners - to examine data and conduct analysis to fully understand the crime drivers in specific hot spots, within a targeted neighborhood. She congratulated the SPD for researching and applying for grant funding to help make this a better city. Earlier this month, Mrs. Tyler attended the Noche De Gala 2016 Hispanic Awards. There were guests from across Northwest Louisiana and the East Texas region, where the achievements of influential Hispanics in our region were celebrated with a night of glamour, success and Las Vegas Style fun. Mayor Tyler reported that this year Shreveport celebrates the 10-Year Anniversary of Allegiant Air offering service from Shreveport Regional Airport with non-stop flights to Las Vegas and Orlando. Last week, our Airport, in partnership with Allegiant Air, launched a campaign in celebration of this incredible milestone. Each week for the next 10-weeks two round trip tickets will be given away to one lucky winner who registers. A grand prize giveaway will be held on December 30, 2016 and one lucky winner will receive 4 round trip tickets and a 3-night stay at the MGM Grand Hotel in Las Vegas. Also, Shreveport Green was one of four national recipients of a \$10,000 Anheuser Busch grant and both the money and that money was put to good use in the restoration of Shreveport's Riverview Park, damaged by floods, begins. ORDINANCE NO 88AOF 2016

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL ORDINANCE NO 88 OF 2016 AND TO READOPT AN ORDINANCE LEVYING VARIOUS TAXES TOTALING SEVENTEEN AND TWENTY-NINE ONE HUNDREDTHS (17 AND 29/100THS) MILLS PER DOLLAR ON ALL PROPERTY SUBJECT TO AD VALOREM TAXATION WITHIN THE CITY OF SHREVEPORT FOR THE YEAR 2016 IN THE AMOUNTS AND FOR THE PURPOSES DESCRIBED HEREIN, AND OTHERWISE PROVIDING WITH RESPECT THERETO.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 88 of 2016 was previously adopted on September 27, 2016 to levy an ad valorem tax millage on all property subject to ad valorem taxation in the City of Shreveport for the year 2016, and the WHEREAS statements for street repair and maintenance, employee salary and wages and police and fire uniforms and equipment were previously listed in error at (1 and 1/100ths) and each should be instead listed as (1 and 10/100ths); and WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 23(B) of the Louisiana Constitution requires the City Council, in any year in which the reappraisal and valuation provisions of Article VII, Section 18(F) are implemented, to adjust the ad valorem tax millages of the City of Shreveport so that the total amount of ad valorem taxes collected purpose of general operating expenses of the General Fund; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Shreveport in due and legal session convened, that an ad valorem tax of Ten and Zero Nine One Hundredths (10 and 09/100ths) mills per dollar of assessed valuation be and the same is hereby levied on all property subject to ad valorem taxation within the City of Shreveport, for the year 2016; for the purpose of general operating expense of the General Fund; and

WHEREAS, an ad valorem tax of Eighty-one One Hundredths (81/100ths) mills per dollar of assessed valuation be and the same is hereby levied on all property subject ad valorem taxation within the City of Shreveport; and

WHEREAS, an ad valorem tax of One and Forty-four One Hundredths (1 and 44/100ths) mill per dollar of assessed valuation be and the same is hereby levied on all property subject to ad valorem taxation within the City of Shreveport, for the year 2016; the purpose of providing revenues sufficient to enable the City of Shreveport to provide a three-platoon system in the Police Department, now in effect in the City of Shreveport in accordance with Act 323 of the Legislature of Louisiana for the year 1936.

WHEREAS, an ad valorem tax of One and Ten One Hundredths (1 and 10/100ths) mills per dollar of assessed valuation be and the same is hereby levied on all property subject to ad valorem taxation within the City of Shreveport, for the year 2016; for the purpose of improving, repairing, and maintaining the streets of the City of Shreveport, title to which shall be in the public, in accordance with the results of a special election held April 6, 2013.

WHEREAS, an ad valorem tax of One and Ten One Hundredths (1 and 10/100ths) mills per dollar of assessed valuation be and the same is hereby levied on all property subject to ad valorem taxation within the City of Shreveport, for the year 2016; for the purpose of continuing the salary and wage schedule of City employees, in accordance with results of a special election held April 6, 2013.

WHEREAS, an ad valorem tax of One and Ten One Hundredths (1 and 10/100ths) mills per dollar of assessed valuation be and the same is hereby levied on all property subject to ad valorem taxation within the City of Shreveport for the year 2016; for the purpose of police and fire personnel and allowance for uniforms and equipment for said departments in accordance with the results of a special election held April 6, 2013.

WHEREAS, an ad valorem tax One and Sixty-five One Hundredths (1 and 65/100ths) mills per dollar of assessed valuation be and the same is hereby levied on all property subject to ad valorem taxation within the City of Shreveport, for the year 2016; for the purpose of providing funds for the City's portion of pensions, employee life insurance and hospitalization plan for City employees in accordance with the results of a special election held April 6, 2013.

BE IT ORDAINED, that Ordinance No. 88 of 2016 shall be repealed and that this ordinance shall be adopted.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this ordinance shall be full authority to the Tax Assessor of Caddo Parish and the Tax Assessor of Bossier Parish to extend said taxes on the assessment rolls of the City of Shreveport for the year 2015.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Director of Finance, Ex Officio Tax Collector of the City of Shreveport, is hereby empowered, authorized, and directed to cause said taxes, as herein above set forth in the amount totaling Seventeen and Twenty-nine One Hundredths (17 and 29/100ths) mills per dollar, to be spread upon the tax roll of the City of Shreveport for the year 2016, to collect said ad valorem taxes for and on behalf of said City, according to law, and to place the same to the credit of the funds described herein above as authorized by law. The taxes herein levied shall become a permanent lien and privilege on all property subject to taxation as herein set forth, and the collection thereof shall be enforceable in the manner provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Clerk of Council shall provide a certified copy of this ordinance to the Tax Assessor of Caddo Parish and the Tax Assessor of Bossier Parish immediately after its final passage by the City Council and approval by the Mayor.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that if any provision or item of this ordinance and the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items or applications and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared severable.
