### **Suspect arrested in shooting injuring local teen**

A Shreveport man is now in police custody following his alleged role in a shooting which sent a local teen to the hospital this past weekend.

On Sunday May 14, 2017 just before 10:00 p.m., Shreveport Police officers responded to University Health hospital after a 13 year old male arrived at the emergency room suffering an apparent gunshot wound to the back. Following treatment, the teen remains hospitalized but is expected to recover. Patrol officers working the incident received information which led them to quickly locate the original crime scene at a residence located in the 700 block of Browning Street. Shreveport Police homicide investigators were summoned to the scene and on their arrival launched a subsequent investigation.

As the inquiry progressed, authorities were able to determine Kadamion Jackson, 19, of the 7800 block of Woodfield Drive, was in possession of a semi-automatic pistol, when he is believed to have mishandled the weapon, causing it to fire, striking the teen in the back. Investigators suspect Jackson then transported the juvenile from the scene of the shooting, to University Health hospital and fled the Shreveport area immediately following. Just after 1:00 p.m. on May 15, 2017, Louisiana State Police conducted a traffic stop on Jackson's vehicle along a stretch of Interstate 20 in Claiborne Parish. Upon their contact with Jackson, Troopers observed what appeared to be evidence a crime may have been committed inside the vehicle. Troopers detained Jackson and subsequently learned the Shreveport Police Department was investigating a shooting in which Jackson may have been linked. Upon gathering additional information and evidence, Shreveport Police Homicide investigators procured a warrant for Jackson's arrest for the offense of Illegal Use of a weapon. At current, Jackson is being held as a fugitive at the Claiborne Parish Sheriff's Office awaiting extradition back to Shreveport. Bond in the matter has been set at \$25,000.
